Gospel Lk 18:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

God will see those who cry to him vindicated.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear

of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear

of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."



And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

Reflection on the Gospel ... What will I apply this teaching to my life?

The images in the *gospel point to the humanness of prayer*. A woman wants justice. A judge wants peace. **Prayer is a simple & purposeful activity we can take part in anywhere and anytime.** I often pray when I'm out walking or driving for in these times of solitude it is easy to begin a dialogue from my heart and let God know my current concerns. There's no need to save up prayer until you're in a holy place, or a prayerful position. Bring God into your daily activities and discover God as friend.

The Letter to Timothy offers instruction on the importance of Scripture for a Christian – 'from these you can learn wisdom that leads to salvation through faith.'

The Scriptures offer wisdom for our faith, they are books about the religious experience of Israel and the early Christians, they are not books on ancient history, or science or cosmology. This week see if you can accept the challenge to **set aside some time to sit and read a Scripture passage**, slowly and prayerfully. Asking God to open your eyes to the wisdom God wants to reveal to you. **Never lose heart**
