From the Acting AP.....

Top Numeracy Tips for Parents

• Talk positively about maths with your child – even if you struggled with it at school yourself. Staying positive about maths will help your child. Saying "I was bad at maths" can lower a child's own expectations of themselves at maths and can give your child an excuse not to try.

• Talk to your child about how you use maths in everyday life – while shopping, banking, budgeting, cooking, driving, and keeping score in sports games, telling the time etc.

• Help your child to see the real-life purpose for the maths they are learning at school e.g. when your child is learning fractions you could ask them: "How many slices will I need to cut the pizza into so that everyone has two slices?"

• Play games with cards, dominoes or dice to help your child with maths. Try asking your child to tell you the number of dots on the dice each time they are thrown during a board game. Eventually they will be able to do 'see' the number without having to count the dots.

From the Acting AP cont'd.....

• When you are helping your child with their maths homework and they get stuck, try to help your child solve the problem themselves by asking: "What is the problem asking you to do?"

"How do you think we can work this out?" "Do you think you will need to use addition or subtraction, or do you need to use multiplication or division?"


• Ask your child to explain how they work things out – e.g. "What is the question asking you to do?" and "How did you get that answer?" With maths problems there is always more than one way to get the right answer. When you child thinks about how they figured out a problem, it can help concepts make more sense to them and build their confidence.

• Talk with your child about how they feel about maths. They may not always be willing to discuss problems they're having, but it is important to show your support and that you are interested in what they are learning.

Family Maths Challenge

Here are some delicious biscuits! How many biscuits are there? What if you had 2 packets? Or 5 packets? Or 10 packets? What would it look like if you spread the biscuits out in an array? Could you draw it? How many packets of biscuits would I need to buy to give all of my classmates one biscuit each? 2 each? 3 each? If 1 packet costs \$5.00, how much would one biscuit cost?

What if I had to buy 6 packets? How much would that cost?

I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

Reflection on the Gospel

In answer to his questing, **Jesus replied that John should rather look at what was happening on the ground in His healing ministry and orientation to the poor. Those are the signs that the reign of God has begun.** John the Baptist was prepared to seek and accept the answer to the question which was crucial to him, even though the answer might upset his preconceptions. **He was a true seeker after Truth.**

All our activities as a school in building community, forming faith, serving the poor, participating in the liturgy, should be undertaken so that a seeker after Truth might see and hear the evidence of the presence and mission of the risen Lord Jesus Christ amongst us.


YEAR 6 GRADUATION 7th December, 2016

2017 Diocesan School Fees

Dear parents and carers

Please find below the 2017 Diocesan school fees schedule which includes a modest 3.0% increase on the fees from 2016. Every effort has been made to keep the fee increase to a minimum and I am pleased to report that the increase is *less than* the 3.3% education CPI increase for the same period.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 3.0% increase to ensure we have consistency across our Diocese. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

I appreciate that from time to time, some families might experience financial challenges. With this in mind, I take this opportunity to remind you that confidential fee support is available through

- discounts for families with multiple siblings in our schools
- flexible payment plans
- hardship concession policies for families in need
- the Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund
- the Byawalla Co-contribution Scheme for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Diocesan Building Levy - 2017

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us, through our capital works program, to meet the demand for new schools and new classes in high growth areas, and to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard.

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2017 is \$756 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$252 payable in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents - 2017

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2017 is **\$1,869 per student, payable in three equal** instalments of **\$623 in Terms 1, 2 and 3**. The fee applies to new students on the following visa numbers: 173, 401, 402, 411, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 456, 457, 459, 462, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 884, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a *per family* basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Thank you for your continuing support of Catholic education. Please be assured that we will continue to provide exciting learning experiences for them within our Catholic faith environment.


