


Congratulations also goes to the Kondek family, Amelia (10) on the birth of a new baby boy, Nathan James who was born on Monday.

Android Users


Step ()

Tap the Applications icon, then tap the internet icon to open your web browser.

Type www.skoclbag.com.au/rpstmarys into the address bar.



Step (1)

Once loaded you can save the Skoolbag loon to your home screen for easy access every day. For example with a Samsung Galaxy S2 & S3 phone, tap the menu button, then tap the "Add Shortcut to Home".

iPhone users

Simply search for "Our Lady of the Rosary Primary, St Marys" in the App store on your phone, PC or Mac and install the skoolbag app.

After the app is installed on your phone, make sure that you select "OK" to allow push notifications. Also click on 'more' then 'Setup' and select which grades you would like to receive push notifications for.

Android users

Simply search for "Our Lady of the Rosary Primary, St Marys" in the Google Play Store on your phone, PC or Mac and install the skoolbag app.

After the app is installed click on 'more' then 'Setup' and select which grades you would like to receive push notifications for.

If you would like to request a paper copy of the newsletter, please send a note into the school office with your name, eldest child's name and class.

So you want to volunteer at school!

Please note that all parents/carers that help out at the school either as classroom helpers, excursion volunteers, parents association etc, need to complete the online Child Protection Training module according to Catholic Education Office OHS/Child Protection requirements.

When you come into the school to help out in any area, or if you are attending an excursion you are required to sign in and out at the office and wear a Parent Volunteer badge.

To complete the online module:

- 1. Go to: http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au/home
- 2. Scroll down to Volunteer section.
- 3. Open the module by clicking the **Start** link.
- 4. Read through the presentation. Then complete and submit the multiple choice quiz questions. This will take approximately 40 minutes. After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing your name, email address, contact number, contact address and choose the school's name from the drop down list.
- A notification of your successful completion of the module will be sent via email to the school and also to your email address.
- 6. All information will be kept confidential.



Back to school safety tips for parents and carers Your child's safety depends on you

Drop off and pick up by car Make sure your children are in an appropriate child restraint that is fitted and used correctly

Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone as children are about and can be unpredictable

Look out for buses pulling out - watch for wig wag lights

Always park and turn legally around schools and avoid dangerous manoeuvres like U-turns and three-point turns.

Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

Drop the kids off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop off and pick up area. Calling out to them from across the road can be dangerous because they may run to you without checking traffic.

It's safest for the kids to get out of the car on the kerb side of the road to be away from passing traffic.

Walking together to and from school Plan your trip to school so you are using pedestrian crossing areas where possible

Always hold your child's hand up until the age of eight. Young children need your help to spot danger like vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic.

Drop off and pick up your child near the school gate and avoid calling them from across the road.


Talk to your children about Stop, Look, Listen and Think every time they cross the road.

- · Stop one step back from the kerb.
- . Look for traffic to your right left and right again.
- Listen for the sounds of approaching traffic.
- · Think whether it is safe to cross.

Young children can learn these safe pedestrian habits from you and continue them later on when they are old enough to travel alone.
