Dear Parents and Friends,

As part of our focus on school effectiveness, Our Lady of The Rosary Primary School will be participating in an online survey for

parents teachers and students – Tell Them From Me (TTFM). TTFM replaces The Quality Catholic Surveys which were conducted in the Parramatta between 2012 until 2017. The new TTFM survey will

provide school teams with valuable feedback on what parents, teachers and students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that members of the community interact. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help them improve the learning for children.

In the next few weeks all students in year 4, 5 & 6 will be given the opportunity and time to participate in this survey during regular school hours. Students who agree to complete the survey will be given a random username and password to access and complete the survey online. Students' names cannot be linked to their responses which allows it to be completely anonymous. Results will show all student scores combined together - it is not possible to single out individual students in the results.

The Tell them from me survey takes approximately 25-30 minutes to complete. The survey measures include such topics as emotional and social well-being, physical health, and behaviours and attitudes linked to student success. It also allows students to give their thoughts and feedback in open-ended question responses.



SACRIFICE



Last week we had the privilege of

welcoming Mr Frank Lawton and Mr John Foeken (Former Navy Chiefs) to the OLR Anzac Day Ceremony. It is very fitting to honor and thank the many, servicemen and servicewomen, who have gone before us to make Australia the wonderful nation it is today, as we ponder the concept of: 'Sacrifice'

A story is told about a Lt. Col. Arnaud Beltrame who took the place of a hostage in a gunfight in

France. He unfortunately died from his wounds sustained from this heroic act. Many grandparents and great grandparents of this great nation fought for us in world wars. Thousands of ANZACS died or suffered from their wounds for the rest of their lives. They sacrificed their health, their freedom and even their lives for those they loved and many people they didn't even know.

When we read stories of courage displayed when people put themselves in terrible danger to save someone else, we may ask ourselves, "What would I have done? Would I have been brave enough?"

Until we are tested, we can never know how we would behave in a life or death situation. But the idea of sacrifice is not only for those moments of crisis. Sacrifice can be seen every day in small and big actions, when we put aside our own selfish needs.

It is sacrifice when your mother stays up late into the night to make a costume for you for the school play.

It is sacrifice when your mum or dad misses a family party to stay with you when you are sick and cannot go.

It is sacrifice when you give up a seat on the bus for someone older or weaker than yourself.

It is sacrifice when you spend time helping someone instead of enjoying your time off.

It is sacrifice when you give your brother or sister the last piece of cake.

What other sacrifices do you make in your daily life?

By these everyday sacrifices, we learn important lessons for life. We learn that our needs often come second to the needs of others. We learn, we like ourselves better when we think of others.

We become the kind of person other people admire and rely on.

Sacrifice is an important part of the Easter story.

Sacrifice is also one of the ANZAC ideals.

If we practise small sacrifices, we can be confident that, if like Colonel Beltrame or our brave

ancestors, we are ever tested, we will rise to the challenge. Inside us all is that brave, selfless soul.

NAPLAN 2018


Next week, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, all students in Australian schools in years 3,5,7 & 9 will participate in the 2018 National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). The results of these tests will provide information on each students achievements in reading, writing, grammar, spelling and numeracy. Parents will receive in term 3 a report indicating their child's achievement in these areas of their education. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the National and Parramatta Diocesan results.

Next Friday will be the Naplan 'Catch up" day for students who missed a test due to absence or illness. Parents of children in years 3 & 5 are asked to ensure that children are at school next week to complete the Naplan Assessments. For further information please see your child's teacher.

What is PBS4L?

Positive Behaviour Support for Learning



A whole school approach to supporting the learning and wellbeing needs of all students. In 2014 OLR committed to the PBS4L framework to support a consistent, school-wide system of support that helps define, teach and support appropriate student behaviours, creating a positive school environment.We have been able to promote positive student behaviour by creating positive learning environments that promote wellbeing. The purpose of the PBS4Lframework is:

- to reduce behavioural problems in a proactive way and therefore increase time for instruction and learning
- to help all students feel connected to the whole school community
- * to increase wellbeing
- * to reduce absenteeism
- * to create a positive school climate
- * to maximise learning.

A whole school document has been created that outlines the expectations of the students in 3 clear areas:

- We are Respectful
- We are Safe
- We are Learners

You will hear these words used by teachers in every

classroom and on the playground every day. We have developed processes to ensure that the teachers are able to track student behaviour and thus provide support where needed.

Playground Forms

• These have been developed to monitor and keep track of playground behaviour. They are entered into a database where we collect and use the data to inform our next steps.

Classroom Forms

• These allow teachers to monitor and keep track of classroom behaviour as well as provide students an opportunity to reflect on their behaviour and consider better choices. These forms are entered into a database where we collect and use the data to inform our next steps.

Note home for parents

When students are not meeting the expectations in the classroom or playground a note will be sent home. This is to ensure we communicate and keep the partnership between home and school positive. At times students will have time out during lunch time to reflect on their behaviour choices and discuss this with a member of the Leadership team.

Everyone has a voice in PBS4L – students, staff and parents.

We have the same behaviour expectations for all (including teachers and parents behaviour – e.g., treating all with respect)

• It is based on the principle that we teach behaviour in the same way we teach academics – by guiding, re-teaching and providing support to help solve the problem.

If you have any issues or concerns about your child's behaviour your first point of call is the classroom teacher.

Teachers are always available to discuss your child's needs – just make an appointment through the office.

The next step is the Stage Leader, Assistant Principal, then Principal.

We thank all parents for your constant support of the staff who work extremely hard to provide a safe and supporting learning environment for your children.

Our ultimate aim is to reward those students who consistently display positive behaviour. Children can reach **Row boat** (Stage Leader Award), then **Sail boat** (Assistant Principal Award), and **Speed Boat** (Principal Award).

Well done to the students who have already reached Rowboat level. Their names appear in this Newsletter.

Kind Regards....Let us remember that as many hands build a house, so many hearts make this school.
