## Expectations for the New Year

As we welcome back the new school it's a good time to consider what you expect of your children. Having expectations that are high—yet also realistic—is essential for school success. Think of a balloon. If there's no air (like no expectations), it's flat. If you put in too much air (expectations that are too high and impossible to meet), the balloon bursts. Finding the right balance of expectations will stretch children to grow without frustrating them.



Tips for primary school children:

- Help children develop predictable routines around waking up, getting ready for the day, eating nutritious meals, taking care of their bodies, going to bed at a regular time, and getting enough sleep. Children are more likely to be successful when their routines help them thrive.
- Build on your children's interests. They're more likely to meet high expectations when they're doing things they enjoy.
- Talk with your children about the goals you've set and achieved in your life. Explain how you overcame obstacles to meet your goals.
- Expect bumps along the way. Achieving high expectations is not like climbing a ladder where each step is a step up. Expect setbacks and doubts. They're all part of the process. The key is to work through the difficulties along the way.
- Encourage children to grow and develop at their own pace. Don't compare your child to other children. Some are early walkers. Some are late walkers. Both are acceptable for the individual child. Follow your child's lead.
- Watch out for pressures that you place on your child because of your preferences rather than your child's needs. For example, not all sports-passionate parents are going to have sports-passionate children.
- Have high expectations for homework and schoolwork.
- Help children break large, difficult tasks into smaller, more manageable tasks. This is called 'chunking' and can build confidence as they achieve each part.

## <u> Attendance Focus for 2021</u>

As you would be aware, student absenteeism impacts on student achievement, wellbeing and efficiency. I once again invite parents and children to make this a focus in 2021.



#### **Key Facts About School Attendance**

- Attendance affects academic achievement. Every day of attendance contributes towards a child's learning and enhances academic achievement
- Attendance has a strong relationship with student outcomes as measured by NAPLAN scores. Each percentage point increase in attendance is related to higher student outcomes by an average of 2-3 NAPLAN scale score points in numeracy, reading, spelling, writing and grammar & punctuation
- Absence from school is associated with academic achievement in the current year as well as future years
- If children do not attend school regularly they miss out on the chance to build a good attendance habit
- Being absent for one day of school each fortnight (2 days a month) adds up to missing more than a year of learning over 10 years.
- Sporadic absences affect academic achievement as much as consecutive days
- School attendance patterns are established early in Kindergarten and Year 1

## **SCHOOL PAYMENTS**

As per CEDP guidelines, we are no longer permitted to take cash as payment. All payments (clothing pool, school fees, has & bags) at the school, need to be made by eftpos.



## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- What do I do if my child is late for school?

  If your child is late for school, you need to bring them into the school office and have them signed in. You cannot use the skoolbag app to provide a late note.
- What do I do if I need to pick my child up early from school?
   If you need to collect your child early from school, you need to send a note into the school office explaining the reason you need to collect your child, this note needs to be approved by the Principal. Then when you come into the office to collect your child, the office staff will call your child to the office and sign them out.
- What do I do if my child is away from school?

  If your child is away from school for any reason, complete an Absentee Note through the skoolbag app or send in a note to your child's teacher explaining the absence when your child returns to school.
- What do I do if I change my address or phone number?
   It is important that the school has your correct contact information for both your-self and your emergency contacts. Should you change your address or phone number, please complete a change of details form at the school office.
